Orinda Filter Plant	88-12	11.15.1988	190 Camino Pablo	Orinda Filter Plant is a property located on a 16 1/2 acre site located at 190 Camino Pablo, Orinda (APN:263-110-001). The property boundaries are set forth more fully in Exhibit A of the ordinance)
Orinda Community Center/Orinda Union School	88-13	12.13.1988	26 Orinda Way	Portions of the Orinda Community Center - The property is known as the Orinda Community Center, formerly the Orinda Union School, and is located on a 6.98 acre site at 26 Orinda Way, Orinda (APN: 260-200-005). The property boundaries are set forth more fully in Exhibit A of the ordinance. Portions of the site designated as a historic landmark include only the 1939 Community Center Building and extending north to the northern boundary of the parcel.
Tres Ranchos Boundary Marker and Monument	89-7	7.11.1989	251 Sundown Terrace	Tres Ranchos Boundary Marker and Monument - is located on the southern boundary of Lot 27 at 251 Sundown Terrace, Orinda (APN: 266-353-006). The property boundaries are set forth more fully in Exhibit A of the ordinance.
Orinda Bridge	89-9	1.9.1990	Orinda Way & Camino Pablo	The property known as the Orinda Bridge is located at Orinda Way and Camino Pablo. The property boundaries are set forth more fully in Exhibit A of the ordinance.
Bien Venida	90-1	4.10.1990	12 Bien Venida	Building known as Bien Venida, is located at 12 Bien Venida, Orinda (APN: 262-160-006). The property boundaries are set forth more fully in Exhibit A of the ordinance.
Miner Ranch (Site)	92-06	8.11.1992	10 Lombardy Lane	Site of the original Miner Ranch. Original home and buildings built by James Ogden Miner were removed years ago. Current residence is not landmarked, only the land. Plaque placed on rock along Miner Road.
Casa Azul	92-13	11.10.1992	8 Camino Lenada	Historic residence and property known as Casa Azul is located at 8 Camino Lenada, Orinda. (APN: 262-131-011) The property boundaries are more fully described in Exhibit A of the ordinance.

Phair's Store, formerly the Orinda Store	93-16	1.11.1994	10 Avenida de Orinda	The property of the Phair's Store, formerly the Orinda Store, is located at 10 Avenida de Orinda. Only the site located at 10 Avenida de Orinda is included in the landmark designation. No existing improvements are included in the landmark designation. The property boundaries are depicted more fully in Exhibit A of the ordinance.
"ORINDA" Sign	94-17	7.26.1994	26 Orinda Way	The historic landmark is the green, metal sign titled "ORINDA", currently located in the Orinda Community Center at 26 Orinda Way.
Joaquin Moraga Adobe	95-1	3.7.1995	24 Adobe Lane	A portion of the single-family residence at 24 Adobe Lane, now known as the Joaquin Moraga Adobe. It is located on a 16.51 acrea site in Orinda (APN: 271-130-003). A floor plan depicting the stages of construction of the Moraga Adobe, sketched by Ella Olive Moraga, and copied from the book, "Moraga's Pride", is attached as Exhibit B of the ordinance. A picture of the residence at 24 Adobe Lane is attached as Exhibit C of the ordinance. See also Chapters three and four of "Moraga's Pride", by Sandy Kimball.
1892 Santa Maria Church Bell	95-3	6.6.1995	20 Santa Maria Way	1892 Santa Maria Church Bell, located at Santa Maria Church at 20 Santa Maria Way in Orinda. The bell is cast in bronze. The is 14 inches tall, has a 17 inch circular base and a 21 inch long yoke. The bell weighs in excess of 600 pounds. A rope wheel is attached to the yoke. The bell is mounted on a 20 inch by 33 inch wood frame. The was built by W.T. Garratt Company of San Francisco in 1892. "W.T. Garratt Co. 1892" is inscribed on the bell. "Garratt Co., San Francisco" is inscribed on the yoke of the bell. Also see Exhibit A, "The Story of the Bell", written by Del Loper.
Bryant Station Site	97-6	7.15.1997	Camino Pablo & Bryant Way	Bryant Station Site Sections can be seen at right side of driveway leading to residence at 2 Bien Venida & behind Community Center Park, just below the Senior Village back entrance.
Historic Mural Map of Orinda	97-08	10.7.1997	BART Station	Historic Mural Map of Orinda is located on the exterior northern wall of the Orinda Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) Station, near the pedestrian entrance.
deLaveaga Station	00-1	4.4.2000	Bates Boulevard & Davis Street	The deLaveaga Station is located at corner of Bate Boulevard and Davis Street, along the St. Stephens Bicycle Trail. The station was originally located on the property now owned by the Orinda Country Club at the North end of the Miner Road trestle.

Tres Ranchos Del Sur Boundary Marker and Monument	03-07	10.7.2003	118 Hillcrest Drive	Tres Ranchos del Sur Boundary Marker & Monument are located on the northern border of 118 Hill crest Drive (APN: 268-320-009).
The Buehler House (Frank Lloyd Wright) + associated structures and gardens	15-01	5.5.2015	6 Great Oak Circle	Frank Lloyd Wright Home, shall be known as The Buehler House, located at 6 Great Oak Circle, Orinda (APN: 269-072-010, 269-072-016, and 269-072-017).
Historic Cast-Iron Lamppost	16-05	12.20.2016	94 Tarry Lane	The Historic Cast-Iron Lamppost located at 94 Tarry Lane (APN: 266-170-020) is a 1920s era cast-iron lamppost with a bronze cap. The lamppost was originally located at the Prinda Triangle at the corner of Orinda Way and Camino Sobrante. The underlying property at 94 Tarry Lane is not proposed for historic designation.
California and Nevada Railroad Trestle Post	16-06	12.20.2016	20 Irwin Way	California and Nevada Railroad Trestle, located at 20 Irwin Way (APN: 260-200-016) is a wooden post which was originally part of a railroad trestle spanning Lauterwasser Creek between Orinda Park and deLavega Stations. The post measures one foot wide by one foot deep and extends out of the ground approximately seven to eight feet tall. The post consists of partially deteriorated natural wood, with some evidence of blue paint which was applied in the past.
The Nelson House	19-01	5.21.2019	511 Miner Road	Modernist residence built in 1951 by architect Richard Neutra located at 511 Miner Road (APN: 261-172-013). Designation also includes several interior fixtures, and gravel pathway to the entrance.
The Paul Hamilton House	21-07	11.2.2021	12 Charles Hill Circle	The Paul Hamilton House is an example of the Second Bay Tradition, a regional idiom of Modernism located at 12 Charles Hill Circle (APN: 260-021-004). Designed by Paul Hamilton and constructed in 1951.
