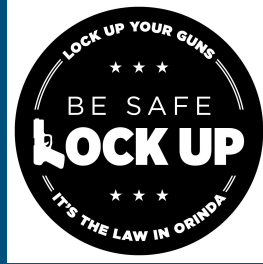

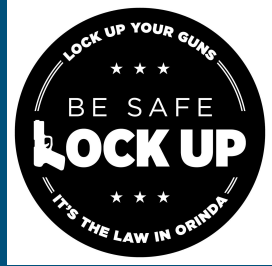

Orinda's Safe Gun Storage Law



“Except when carried on his or her person, or otherwise in his or her immediate control and possession, **no person shall keep a firearm** (as defined in California Penal Code section 16520, as amended from time to time) **in any residence in Orinda owned or controlled by that person unless the firearm is stored in a locked container** (as defined in California Penal Code section 16850, as amended from time to time) **or the firearm is disabled with a safety device** listed on the California Department of Justice’s roster of firearm safety devices (as defined in California Penal Code sections 16540 & 23635, as amended from time to time).”

Safe Gun Storage Saves Lives



- 4.6M children in America live in a household with at least one loaded, unlocked gun.¹
- In 2022, 355 children under 18 in America gained access to a gun and unintentionally shot themselves or others.³
- If households with children that contain at least one unlocked gun switched to locking all their guns, between 6%-32% of youth gun suicides and unintentional deaths could be prevented, saving up to an estimated 251 lives in a single year.⁴

Orinda PD:

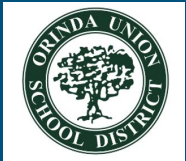

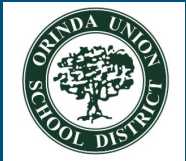
OUSD: Campus Safety

- All OUSD schools have Safety Plans
 - Safety Plans updated annually
- Safety drills are conducted monthly
 - Protocols are reviewed with students in an age-appropriate manner
- Districtwide Safety Committee reviews safety protocols
- Communication
 - Potential Threat: WeTip Reporting System
 - Incident Communication: Centralized communication during an emergency
 - Measure E and I funds used to fund all new PA systems
 - Reunification plans



OUSD: Safety and Mental Health

- Focus is on student wellbeing and mental health
- Positive behavior through Community Circles in all classrooms
- Counseling services available at all OUSD schools; Wellness and Counseling centers
- Bullying prevention curriculum at all schools
- Student support teams providing support and intervention to students

- Examine preventative measures, response to crisis & communication systems
- Consultation with law enforcement
- School facilities improvements
- Increased collaboration/standardization across school sites
- School Climate, Mental Health Support & Crisis Prevention
- School Safety Plans approved annually

AUHSD / MHS Campus Safety

- Incident Training & Response
- Training & Safety drills for staff and students
- Targeted/redundant communication systems
- Coordination with outside agencies (including local law enforcement)

EMERGENCY



Evacuation

Evacuate if:

- You see or smell smoke/fire.
- You hear announcement.
- You hear Fire Alarm ring for 5 minutes.

Remember to:

- Leave belongings; Teachers take emergency bag.
- Line up with current teacher.
- If evacuation is during non-class time, evacuate and line up with your previous class.



Shelter-In-Place

Shelter-In-Place if:

- You hear announcement.

Remember to:

- Immediately go to nearest supervised room.
- Ensure no one is left outside.
- Lock all doors.
- Shut windows and curtains, turn lights off.
- Wait for instructions.



Run-Hide-Defend

Run-Hide-Defend if:

- You see or hear an active threat.
- You hear announcement.

Remember to:

- Use your best judgment to Run, Hide, or Defend.
- Run off campus if necessary.
- If hiding, shut windows and curtains and turn off lights. Lock doors and maintain silence.
- If defending, use all objects against intruder.
